




That's another thing we've learned from your Nation", said Mein Herr, "Map-making. But we've carried it much further than you. What do you consider the largest map that would be really useful?"

"Have you used it much?" I enquired.

















Enjoying noTours requires two different stages. First you need to create your sound walk or sound narrative and then you need to download and play it on your phone.




